

Smarter Discards

The City of Dubuque is looking for volunteers for the new Smarter Discard program. As a volunteer in this free pilot study, you will:

- Authorize your weekly setout data to be collected by the City in anonymized form
- Have access to an online portal for tracking your goals and performance changes
- Receive an organics recycling tool kit (optional)

The information collected through this pilot study will be used in decision-making related to policies, staffing, and equipment issues related to Dubuque's waste management and curbside collection.

Food Scrap Recycling Expansion Announced

The Dubuque City Council approved a contract at their April 15 meeting that allows for the expansion of Dubuque's curbside collection of food scraps for composting program.

City collection customers may either subscribe to dedicated food scrap collection carts (13, 48, or 64 gallons) for an additional fee or place food scraps and compostable paper in with grass clippings, leaves, and other yard debris in their current yard waste cans, carts, and bags.

As a result, many City customers will be able to divert their food scraps for composting at little or no additional cost by adding these materials to their under-filled and/or underweight yard debris containers. Businesses interested in composting should contact their current hauler to setup the service. If they are not able to haul food scraps, contact other private haulers.

Dubuque Jaycee's Community Garden

The Dubuque Jaycee's Community garden was started to connect would be gardeners with a place to grow produce. The gardens can be leased by anyone, but are targeted to people who live in apartments, have strict covenants or just want to be near fellow gardeners. This is not only a means of sustainable local food production, but a way to grow community, togetherness, and family bonds. On site water and shed storage are included. Tenants get the same garden plot back year after year, encouraging them to take pride in it and make it their own.

The Dubuque Jaycee's are looking for businesses to purchase naming rights for each garden plot. For \$200 a year your business will get to name a garden. The garden name will be included on signage and all formal communications regarding that plot.
